## Girl's Brigade

The Girl's Brigade is a Christian, international, uniformed organisation working alongside girls and young women of every background, ability and culture.

### Aims & Motto

The aim of the Girl's Brigade is 'To help girls to become followers of the Lord Jesus Christ, and through self-control, reverence, and a sense of responsibility to find true enrichment of life'.

The programme seeks to develop girls along four lines: mentally, physically, spiritually and socially and is therefore built on the four headings of Spiritual, Physical, Education and Service.

The motto of the Girl's Brigade is to "seek, serve and follow Christ." It is split up into four sections (Explorers 3-7years, Juniors 8-10years, Seniors 11-13years and Brigaders 14-18 years old). All girls, from the Juniors upwards, work towards badges. These are obtained by completing work in the disciplines of spiritual, physical, education and service. As well as the Brigaders Brooch, the girls have the option of working towards the Queens Award, which is the highest award in the GB. All GB sections meet on a Wednesday night, during school term, at **6.30pm** in the Church hall.

The Sunday Club join in at the beginning of our church service at **10.30am** where they enjoy the singing and a message from our Children's Ministry Team. 
Our teachers relate well with all ages. As well as a time of fun, the children get to discuss topics from the Bible that are relevant to their lives today.

## Health Guidelines for Crèche & Rainbow Club

The following guidelines can help you decide if you should bring your child to crèche or Rainbow Club. These guidelines are there to protect you as a parent, your child and the other children.

A child can be placed in crèche if they have had:

1. No fever for the last 24 hours.
2. No runny nose (unless fluid is clear and child is teething or has allergies).
3. No diarrhea or flu symptoms in the last 48 hours.
4. No colds or coughs.
5. No unusual rashes.
